

COVID 19 POLICY

Adhere to social distancing rules as laid out by the Government, that is only one person from your household to be present at any one time.

It is your responsibility, whilst on site, to adhere to a 2 m safe distance from all other persons on site.

Only one person at a time will be allowed in the office area, where you will be asked to use the hand sanitizer provided.

Only fish between the yellow lines on the floor; anyone found to be outside of these lines whilst fishing will be asked to leave the premises with immediate effect without a refund or fish.

Please adhere to Hatchland's Fisheries policy, which is displayed on entry to the property and on the Office wall, also take a copy form from the holder and sign the register to show that you have taken a copy and will adhere to the rules laid out.

Please dispose of all PPE or personal belongings in the appropriate bins provided.

Only card payments will be accepted at present.

On site, there is essential renovation work being undertaken by some large Plant hire vehicles. Please travel around the site with care. We do not accept any liability if accident and/or injury occurs whilst on site due to people disregarding safety protocols in regard to the essential work being carried out.

Please be aware that, at present, only 10 members of the public will be allowed on the site.

It is your (the visitor's) responsibility to ascertain the "essential" nature of your travel to/from the Fisheries.

Please do not touch any areas unnecessarily, for example others equipment, benches, chairs, rods, gateways etc.

No pets, small or other children under the age of 16, or people who are depicted "Vulnerable" under the Government COVID 19 guidelines are permitted on the premises at present.

Hatchland's Trout Farm has undertaken the guidance from the Government Web site and the Angling Trust to produce this policy. It is your responsibility to adhere to it.
